

Two Casts and Four Bass
Ohio Men at White Lake Make a Record Hard to Beat

There has been some famous fishing at White Lake as well as at the other numerous bodies of water in this vicinity, but it remained for Dr. F. D. Davis of Canton, Ohio and T. D. Cross of Minerva, Ohio, members of the "Cro-Ken-Kel-Kirk" Club now camping at Ormond Beach, White Lake, to make a record that will likely stand for some time.

While out fishing on Saturday, July 25, each performed the feat of catching two bass with one cast and the combined weight of the four fish was 12 and 3 quarters pounds. The men were using the "Alliance expert" wooden minnow at the time. Mr. Ormond vouches for the details of the story.
